Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone

As mentioned in a number of newsletters this year, a road safety scheme on both Cheviot View and Parker Place has been planned. This is called the **Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone**.

I have received notification from Northumberland County Council that the Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone is **now active**. **This means that no vehicles can enter and proceed along the lengths of Cheviot View or Parker Place from Monday to Friday, 8:15am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 3:45pm.**

What does this mean in real terms?

Parents and carers should not drive up or down or park on Cheviot View or Parker Place on school days between 8:15am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 3:45pm. This includes parents and carers who are dropping off and collecting children from Red and Green class or parking in either street to drop off or collect from any part of our school.

In a nutshell, nobody other than residents should be entering this area 8:15am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 3:45pm on school days.

What happens if the rules of the Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone are not followed?

Parents and carers who park or drive on Parker Place or Cheviot View between the times listed above are contravening the restrictions. If found doing this, **parents and carers are liable to a Fixed Penalty Notice served by the Police**. To avoid receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice due to parking or driving on Parker Place or Cheviot View between the times listed above, parents and carers are encouraged to use active travel such as walking or cycling rather than private vehicles.

The enforcement of the regulations of the Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone and the serving of Fixed Penalty Notices lies with the Police. As a school, we have no authority to enforce the rules of Seghill First School Pedestrian and Cycle Zone, but ask for your support. The zone has been put in place to keep our children safe.

Summer term begins on **Monday 17 April**. Please remember that **Monday 01 May** and **Monday 08 May** are both Bank Holidays and school will be closed. Children should wear a **plain white t-shirt, plain black or navy shorts or joggers, trainers and their school sweatshirt or cardigan** to school on their PE days. We hope to have PE lessons outside whenever possible. Please ensure long hair is tied back for PE. Children cannot wear earrings for PE. If your child cannot remove their own earrings they should not wear them on PE days. Staff are unable to remove earrings for children.

Leave of absence during term time requests

As we move into the summer term we tend to receive an increased number of leave of absence during term time requests.

We do completely understand that the cost of family holidays during the school holidays can be astronomical. However, we have a **legal duty** to follow the law around attendance, including only authorising leave of absence requests that have **evidence of exceptional circumstances** and referring to the Local Authority for a **fixed penalty notice** to be issued for all unauthorised leave of absence requests.

Parents and carers requesting leave of absence during term time must **submit the request at least two weeks in advance** using the **leave of absence during term time form**. The only leave of absence during term time requests that will be authorised are those where **evidence of exceptional circumstances** is provided. Leave of absence that is taken **without a leave of absence request form being submitted** will not be authorised and will trigger an application from school to the Local Authority for a **fixed penalty notice** to be issued. Leave of absence that is taken **which has not been authorised** is extremely likely to trigger an application from school to the Local Authority for a **fixed penalty notice** to be issued.

Year 4 transition

We are working closely with staff and leaders from Seaton Sluice Middle School and Whytrig Middle School to prepare for **Year 4 transition** to middle school in September 2023.

Transition week will take place during week beginning **Monday 10 July**. Children will go on a visit with their new school on **Monday 10 July**. On **Tuesday 11 July**, children will be here at our school working with Mrs Lyons and a teacher from SSMS. If your child is going to Whytrig, they will go to another SVLP first school on Tuesday.

On **Wednesday, Thursday and Friday**, Year 4 children will spend each day at their middle school. **Morning sessions** at middle school will start at **9:15am** on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and **end at 3:00pm**. This is to allow parents to drop off siblings at feeder first schools and to alleviate potential traffic congestion caused by additional vehicles carrying first school children to middle school sites. Please note that **transport** to and from middle school on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday is **not provided**. It is the responsibility of Year 4 parents and carers to drop off and collect their child at middle school on these three days.

Open Evenings will take place on **Thursday 13 July at SSMS** and **Wednesday 12 July at WMS**.
