# School Relief fundraising days on Thursday 22 and Friday 23 March

We have organised two School Relief fundraising days on Thursday 22 and Friday 23 March to coincide with Sport Relief. The purpose of the events is to raise money to buy Ipads for the children to use in school. We did this two years ago in March 2016 when we raised £2900 and bought a set of Ipads.

Thank you to everyone who came to school in non-uniform on Friday 16 March. We have received many donations for the **chocolate sweety tombola** which will be part of the **School Relief coffee morning** and **book sale** on **Thursday 22 March** from 8:45am in the school hall. Each class will be brought in to the hall during the coffee morning. Hot drinks, juice and cakes will be on sale. **Books** will also be on sale and there will also be a raffle with some lovely sweet treats as prizes. Donations of cakes, buns or biscuits would be very welcome.

Children are asked to come to school in **sporty clothes** on **Friday 23 March** so they can complete their **sponsored run** during the morning. Children do not need to bring school uniform to change in to after the sponsored event and can stay in their sporty clothes all day.

All money raised will be used to buy Ipads for the children to use in school which will add to the set of Ipads that we bought in 2016 following the School Relief fundraising events.

## Mother's day lunch on Friday 09 March

Thank you to everyone who was able to join us for our annual Mother's day lunch on Friday 09 March. Everyone seemed to enjoy the event and especially the lovely meal made by Mrs Rogage.

#### Safety around the school site

I am very disappointed to be writing to parents again about my concerns regarding the safety of our children both before and after school. I expressed my concerns in February edition 1 newsletter, but I must report that there has been no improvement in the situation.

Despite numerous reminders and warnings the following behaviour are still happening before and after school-

- some parents are allowing their children to use the trim trail;
- some parents, particularly in Early Years, are not closely supervising their children when they enter and leave our site. I regularly see children racing ahead of their parents, playing around staff cars in the car park and climbing in the garden which runs parallel to the school drive;
- some children continue to run ahead of their parents and run straight out of the gate and on to Barrass Avenue.

In addition to this, I have noted that some parents of children in key stage 2 seem to be dropping their children off in the yard and leaving them there unsupervised while they leave the premises.

I am aware that many parents do supervise their children closely at all times and do not allow their children to be out of their sight. However there are too many parents who are still not supervising their children closely.

Children are not always able to see the potential danger in some situations therefore we need parents to supervise their children closely to keep them safe in and around our school site. If this situation continues I will address it personally with specific parents and we may have to look at alternative drop off and collection arrangements to ensure the safety of our children. Our CCTV cameras cover our school site, including the entrance to EYFS, the car park and the top yard. We are able to see exactly what is happening at both the beginning and end of the day. Any damage caused to staff cars by children will lead to the cost for any repairs being billed directly to parents.

#### Universal credit and free school meals

Did you know that **Universal Credit** is currently a qualifying benefit for **Free School Meals**? If you receive Universal Credit then your child is entitled to a free meal in school. Claiming free school meals could save you almost **£400 per child per year**, and could enable the school to gain over £2,000 per year extra funding for every child as well. So even if your child doesn't take the free meal, or your child gets a free meal because they are currently in Reception or Key Stage 1, you should apply now if you haven't already.

From **01 April 2018**, the government are introducing a Universal Credit earning threshold of £7,400 per year for free school meal eligibility which means that some families who are eligible now would not be if they apply after 01 April. All children assessed as eligible for Free School Meals by 01 April 2018 will continue to be eligible until at least 2022 without the need for further eligibility checks while Universal Credit is rolled out across the country. **If you receive Universal Credit and are not already claiming free school meals for your child then please visit www.northumberland.gov.uk/fsm or see Mrs Elliott in the office for more information about how to apply.**
