

Medicines in school

Medicine must be **taken to the school office by parents and carers and handed to Mrs Elliott with the completed medication form**. Please do not give medicine to class teachers or children and ask them to take the medicine to the office for you. This could lead to medicine being misplaced, which would be a potential safeguarding breach.

Tickets cost **£3.00** and include a film, sweets and a drink. If your child would like to attend, we have set up a payment portal on **School Gateway**. Click on **payments** and **Movie night March 2023**. Tick the box to give consent for your child to attend, click **add to basket** and pay £3.00 via School Gateway. There will be no after school club on Wednesday 22 March. This portal will be open on School Gateway until **Friday 17 March**, which is the deadline for permission and payments.

We are also offering two different lunchtimes to reduce waiting times for food and to allow Mrs Rogage to be able to make up to 100 extra meals spread across 2 days rather than one day.

Police visit

Mrs Askew has arranged for **police officers** to visit Nursery and Reception on **Tuesday 21 March**. The visit will be part of the topic on road safety. Early Years children have already been visited by fire officers earlier this year, so we are very much looking forward to welcoming their colleagues in the police force to our school. Their visit will be dependent on their availability in response to any local or national issues that may arise on that day, but fingers crossed that they can attend.

Reading book amnesty

Over the last two years we have made a **substantial investment** in buying new books for our reading scheme. We have bought reading books and Book Bag Books, which are used in the classroom and as home reading books. The books come in sets of 10, and we have noticed that quite a few **sets are incomplete** because **books have not been returned to school**. If you have any reading books or Book Bag Books at home, **please return them to school no matter how long you've had them**. Thank you.

Red Nose Day

Following discussions with the children on Wednesday in whole school assembly, we have agreed the following ideas for **Red Nose Day on Friday 17 March**. Children can come to school wearing **non-uniform**. We would like them to **wear something red**- this can be a red top, a red stripe on their shoes, a red sock or something red in their hair. Alternatively, they can design their own **Red Nose Day t-shirt** using an old t-shirt and wear that to school.

We hope that these are all low-cost options which do not involve buying anything new. We are asking for **donations**, which will go directly to the **Red Nose Day appeal**.
