Feedback from our Ofsted inspection

Thank you to all of the parents and carers who responded to the letter I sent regarding parentview and free text during our Ofsted inspection last week and to those of you who spoke to our inspector on Wednesday morning on the yard. Although I am unable to share our grades with you yet, I can say that Miss Vernon, our inspector, said that the children were "a joy to talk to" and that she was consistently impressed by them.

The **draft report** has been sent to school to be checked for factual errors. We are not able to change anything in the report unless there is a factual error. The report has been checked and sent back to Ofsted for a final quality assurance check. As soon as the **final report** is sent to school we will provide a copy for each family and it will be placed on our website. Forty eight hours after that, our report will go live on the Ofsted website. I hope to be able to share the final report with you early next week.

Whole school creative week Monday 05 to Friday 09 February

Following on from the success of our Divali week in the autumn term, we are having another creative week with a focus on Chinese New Year.

Staff are very busy planning a range of activities and events for children in all year groups. If you have any **skills** that you think will be useful during this week, please let us know. We are planning lots of art and creative activities so any **help** with that or mounting and displaying children's work would be brilliant. We would also love **help** with baking, drama, music and dancing, so don't be shy! We would love your help in school and I am sure that you would really enjoy the experience of coming in to school and working with the children. Please let your child's class teacher know.

On Friday Mrs Rogage has very kindly offered to do a **Chinese themed lunch**. More details will follow next week. We will also have our celebration assembly to share what the children have learnt during the week and our half termly awards and celebrations.

Reminder about punctuality

Many children arrive at school on time and are collected on time every day. However, an increasing number of children arrive late for school and are collected late from school. Arriving at school late makes a bad start to the day for the child as it is both embarrassing for them and disruptive to the learning that has already started.

Members of staff are regularly left supervising children after school when they should be in meetings or preparing for the next day because parents have not collected their child on time. Mr Taylor **locks the gates at 8:45am** in line with our policy. If you arrive after 8:45am you will not be able to walk around the internal path to the office as the gates will be locked. Class teachers will not respond to parents knocking on the classroom door nor will Mrs Rogage let children in via the kitchen door. Please be on time to drop off and collect your child. We are not a free childcare service. If your child is not dropped off or picked up on time on a regular basis or if you do not collect your child and we have not been informed, I will need to pass this information on to the Education Welfare Officer and the duty social worker.

Seaton Valley multi skills academy

Four children from red and blue class have been chosen to represent our school in the Seaton Valley multi skills academy. The children will work and play against children from other Seaton Valley first schools in a range of events led by **Mr Dowson**, who provides specialist teaching and after school clubs every Tuesday. The children will also be aiming to set their own personal best scores in each event.

The children have been chosen for consistently demonstrating a very high level of performance in both PE and after school clubs. The first session was at Holywell last week, followed by three more sessions at New Hartley, Seaton Sluice and here at our school. Our team consists of **Megan, Abbie, Oliver and Daniel**.

We are very grateful to **Mrs Dowson**, who is one of our governors and our school sports partnership manager, as she is taking the children to and from the events as well cheering them on while they are taking part. Feedback from the children and Mrs Dowson has been very positive so far and I am sure that it will continue to be. Well done, Megan, Abbie, Oliver and Daniel and thank you Mrs Dowson.
