

# Huggg vouchers for children entitled to Free School meals

We are continuing to provide Huggg **supermarket vouchers** to parents of children who are eligible for **Free School Meals**. This is completely different to Universal Infant Free School Meals. Vouchers are sent out weekly via text.

## **Remote learning**

Remote learning is being provided via Tapestry for children in Orange and Yellow class and via Google Classroom for children in Red, Green and Blue class. Thank you to the teachers who have done a remarkable job in adapting their plans from whole class face to face teaching to remote learning so quickly.

As schools will be closed until at least February half term for many pupils, it is really important that children engage with the remote learning provided by their teachers.

Thank you to everyone who has already logged on and started to complete the tasks they have been given. Class teachers can be contacted directly with queries regarding remote learning using their email addresses-

We can see who has logged into Google Classroom or Tapestry and who hasn't. We will be following this up with phone calls this week.

## **Availability of places in school**

We currently have approximately one third of our pupils in school, with the rest of the children being offered remote learning.

The longevity of our offer in school is highly dependent on staff well-being and safety – we simply can't run the school without staff staying fit and well. We are therefore prioritising staff safety and strictly limiting class numbers. Both groups in school are currently full.

# Covid-19 update

It looks likely that school staff will start to receive **weekly Covid tests** in the near future. This will no doubt provide us with some asymptomatic positive test results and may well impact on what we can offer in terms of face to face teaching in school.

Given the prevalence of the virus in England, it is highly likely that we will have to **send home a whole class group**, rather than small groups of children, in the event of a **positive test result**.

It is therefore worth having a **Plan B** for child care available to you, just in case we need to send your child home to isolate for a number of days or if we have to close your child's group. Hopefully this won't happen but it's always good to have a backup plan, particularly as any changes we are required to make are likely to be at short notice.

## **Devices from the DfE**

You may have read in the media that the DfE is providing **laptops and tablets** to schools to help children and families in need to access remote education during coronavirus (COVID-19). Devices have been made available for disadvantaged children in certain year groups who:

- are affected by disruption to face-to-face education at their school
- have been advised to shield because they are clinically extremely vulnerable.

We have been informed that our school is eligible for **10 devices**. Each school's allocation is based on the number of children in the school, free school meals data and an estimate of the number of devices a school already has. Please note that these devices are loaned out to families and must be returned to school at the end of the loan period.

We received our 10 laptops this week along with loan agreements. They will be set up by our ICT support team on Monday, ready for collection. Sharing 10 laptops between 43 children was never going to be an easy task. We have prioritised children who are working from home (rather than those who are at school) and families who have said that they do not have access to a device. If you have been allocated a laptop, we will contact you next week. Laptops can be collected from school by appointment and loan agreements must be signed before the laptop can be taken home.

## Extra laptops

In addition to the 10 laptops we have been allocated by the DfE, we are going to buy 6 more laptops. These have been funded through donations from within our school and our community and our school budget. I will provide details of these donations in the next newsletter.

## **Food bank at Seghill Community Centre**

The **Community Food Pantry** has set up a drop in **food bank** in conjunction with **Fareshare** where families can call in and get a bag of fresh produce to top up their supplies. This takes place every **Wednesday between 11:30am and 12:30pm at Seghill Community Centre**. It is open to all families, not just those eligible for Free School Meals.

If they receive donations, they can put together hampers to help families. If you would like to make a donation, please go to the Community Centre on Wednesday to find out more.

# When will school reopen to all pupils?

The short answer is "I don't know". As a headteacher, I find out what is happening at exactly the same time as you and the rest of the country. I tuned into the Prime Minister's announcement on Monday 04 January at 8:00pm to hear that schools were closing with immediate effect to all pupils except specific groups at exactly the same time as you. We have no advance notice of decisions.

I have heard from some sources that schools will be given two weeks' notice of them reopening. At least one union that represents headteachers is certainly lobbying the government for this.
