Ongoing protective measures

We ask that you continue to follow these principles-

- bring your child to school every day and be on time;
- follow our one way system, even if you think there is no-one checking;
- wear your **face covering** and maintain a **distance** from other parents and carers while on the school site.

Please do not bring your child to school if they, or anyone in your family is **showing any of the symptoms of Covid-19**. If your child or anyone in your family is showing symptoms of Covid-19, please arrange for them to be tested and all stay at home until you have the results. Missing one school day to ensure that no-one in the family is positive is better than potentially bringing Covid into our school. All staff continue to do their twice weekly lateral flow tests at home. So far all results have been negative. Some staff have received their first Covid vaccination.

Reporting a test result to school

If your child shows symptoms of Covid-19, please arrange for them to take a test and self-isolate until you receive the results.

Parents must inform school of any test result, even if the test result is negative. Parents must inform school of any test result even if your child's year group is currently closed or if school is closed due to a weekend or a school holiday. Please don't send us a message via School Gateway, our school Facebook page or Tapestry. These systems are not always checked every day and a delay in notifying us of a result could mean that other children and staff being put at risk.

If you are worried about the safeguarding of a child, please ring school on 0191 237 0419 or our **safeguarding number** 07785 180484. This mobile number can also be used to report a Covid test result if you do not have email access. Your call may go straight to answer machine, but messages are checked every day.

Reminder about drop off routines

Orange, Yellow and Blue class children start school at 8:45am. Green and Red class children start school at 8:50am. Please ensure that your child is **closely supervised** before school. Children should not be running around next to staff cars, in the garden parallel to the drive, on the trim trail or on Cheviot View.

Also, please remember that drop off time is very busy for staff. Teachers and teaching assistants are trying to get children safely into their classrooms. They cannot engage in lengthy conversations with parents and carers at the same time. If you do need to discuss an issue with your child's class teacher, please phone the school office to make an appointment for a call back or contact the class teacher directly using their email address.

Summer term curriculum

We have planned our teaching of **foundation subjects** into one and two week blocks for the rest of this term. We have done this to give the children as much opportunity as possible to be **immersed in each subject**. It is hard to get going on any topic if you are only learning about it once a week. We have had a two week history topic and we are in the middle of a two week science topic.

For the first two weeks of this term, children have been learning about the Queen in our **history topic**- her family and her role in our country and beyond. We have had celebrations for her birthday and Blue class have been learning about her role as head of the Commonwealth.

This week and next week, our **science topic** is focused on plants and forces. Hopefully the children will have been keeping you up to speed with the planting that they have been doing so far.

When our science fortnight comes to an end, we will be moving into **art fortnight** and then a **PSHE week** before the end of this half term. Subjects which have not yet been covered will be the focus during the second half of the summer term.

The focus for each subject runs through the **whole school**. Although children in each class will be looking at different elements, the overall theme is the same in every year group.

Staffing update

Mrs Askew and her husband are thrilled to be expecting their second baby. Mrs Askew's maternity leave was due to start at the end of the summer term. However, due to complications that Mrs Askew is suffering during her pregnancy, she has been identified as Clinically Extremely Vulnerable. She has been advised to work from home unless we can guarantee strict social distancing and use of face masks. We can guarantee that staff wear face coverings and maintain a social distance at all times, however, we cannot expect our youngest children to keep a distance of 2m from Mrs Askew or wear face coverings. We have therefore had to take the decision that Mrs Askew could not return to work after the Easter break in order to protect her and her unborn baby.

Mrs Askew was understandably very disappointed, as she was desperately keen to be at school. However, she accepts that this is the only safe option for her at the moment.

We have been able to appoint Miss Tamara Neal to work as the Nursery teacher from now until the end of the summer term. **Miss Neal** completed her final teaching experience here a couple of years ago and is well known to our school. She is working closely (but remotely) with Mrs Askew and is also being supported by Mrs Kembrey and the rest of the Early Years team while she becomes familiar with our routines and procedures. Miss Neal has settled in very quickly and is already doing a great job.
