#### **Reading books, spellings and homework**

Here is a reminder of our expectations for reading books, spellings and homework.

Reading books and reading records should be brought to school every day.

Spellings should be practised twice in the spelling book and returned to school by Wednesday every week. Homework should be completed in the homework book and returned to school, by Wednesday every week.

We know that everyone is busy and it can be hard to manage everything. However, it is **adding a significant amount to our workload every day** when we are chasing after reading books, spelling books and homework books that are not at school on time.

When children don't have their reading book in school every day we can't listen to them read. Missing spelling books mean that spellings are not written in the book for their test and new spellings are sent home on slips of paper and inevitably being lost. New homework sheets cannot be stuck in when the book is at home. We would really appreciate your help so children have the right things in school on the right days.

Hopefully these new bollards will improve safety for both pedestrians and vehicles. Please walk inside the bollards, rather than down the middle of the road or on the road side of the bollards, so you are separated from vehicles and vehicles are separated from pedestrians.
