#### **Sport for Champions fundraising event**

Mrs Lyons has written a letter about our **Sport for Champions fundraising circuit challenge** on **Wednesday 28 June** which will be coming home with your child today. We hope this challenge will prove to be a way to encourage our children to take part in healthy activities while raising some money for school funds and supporting local athletes.

We are thrilled that our athlete is going to be **Stephen Miller**, a three-time paralympic champion. When he was young, Stephen took part in the school sports club once a week and began competing in junior regional events and competitions. He says that his biggest achievement was breaking his own world record when he threw 33.53m in the club throw to take not only the world record but another Paralympic gold.



We will keep 60% of the funds raised to spend on resources that will provide enriching opportunities for our children. The remaining 40% will go to professional athletes in need of support.

#### **Key stage 2 Dream Big engineering project**

Children in Years 3 and 4 have been working in partnership with the **National Literacy Trust Dream Big engineering project**. Workshops have been running throughout this half term, looking at the roles of **different types of engineers**, including civil, software, aerospace and marine engineers. The children have also been learning about famous engineers, such as Emily Roebling and Raye Montague. Learning has been led through carefully chosen focus texts.

Today the children have been taking part in a **design challenge** in the hall, working in teams with key stage 2 staff and volunteers from the project. You can see pictures on the next page.

Following on from this project, we have been invited to take our children to **Northumbria University** to take part in a morning of engineering at the university campus. The purpose of the visit will be to **promote engineering and technical careers** to our children. They will be able to meet people from the university's **engineering and environment team**, and have a tour of the facilities. This will help the children to put the pieces together between what they've talked about in school during the sessions and the jobs that engineers do and the spaces and facilities they work in.

What an **amazing opportunity** for our children to visit the university and see first-hand the jobs that they could have in the future. We'll confirm the date after half term.
