Class coffee mornings

Thank you to everyone who was able to join us for our class coffee mornings this week. Overall, it was disappointing to see such poor attendance from parents and carers- only 21 children out of 103 were represented at the coffee mornings. The teachers spent a great deal of time planning them and providing useful information about what your child will be learning. We will look at this again next school year in order to try to improve attendance.

Cycling with Richard Rothwell for Year 4

Children in Year 4 will be working with **Richard Rothwell** and Mrs Lyons next week. We have worked with Richard for a number of years now and have great respect for his expertise and knowledge of cycling. Richard works with many schools and offers a range of cycling experiences for riders of all abilities.

The children in Year 4 will be split in to two groups. Starting on Tuesday 02 May, one group (group 1) will cycle with Richard and Mrs Lyons all day on the Tuesday and on Wednesday morning. The other group (group 2) will work in school. The groups will swap over on Wednesday lunchtime, so group 2 will cycle with Richard and Mrs Lyons on Wednesday afternoon and all day Thursday, while group 1 works in school. Mrs Lyons will let you know which group your child is in. A separate letter with more information was sent out to all Year 4 children earlier this week.

Red and Green class assembly

Thank you to all the parents and carers in Red and Green class who joined us for their **class assembly** this morning. All of the boys and girls in Red and Green class did an amazing job. We were all super impressed with your clear reading voices, paintings and singing. Well done, everyone.

Arrangements for the king's coronation

On Friday 05 May we are having a special coronation picnic lunch for all the children to mark the King's coronation. Mrs Rogage will be making a coronation packed lunch for the children, including fresh sandwiches made to order on Friday morning. As well as a sandwich, the children will get crisps, a sausage roll, a drink of juice and a coronation muffin.

We have asked the older children which sandwich filling they would like. We've asked parents and carers of the younger children to make sure everyone gets what they like.

We will not be providing a hot meal on Friday 05 May. If you do not want your child to have a coronation packed lunch, please let Mrs Elliott know, and provide a packed lunch for your child.

Staff will eat their lunch with the children. We are hoping to have lunch in the middle garden, but we will make the decision on the day depending on the weather. Children and staff are invited to wear red, white and blue on Friday 05 May.

Sports mornings

Class teachers have given me feedback from coffee mornings and have passed on your questions and comments. Something that was discussed at coffee mornings was why parents and carers are not invited to sports mornings.

Sports mornings will take place on **Tuesday 27 June** for Years 1 to 4 and Wednesday 28 June for Nursery and **Reception** in PE lessons. We have planned the sports mornings to take place in PE lessons rather than as separate sports events. In the past, we have planned sports days and invited parents and carers to watch. Parents and carers take time off work and change their plans to come, then the event is inevitably cancelled due to rain or the field being too wet. Parents and carers then had to reschedule their time off at very short notice, which led to a load of stress for everyone. Also, it was very difficult to keep our site secure while allowing parents and carers in. We had to operate a policy where no adults could enter or leave the site while the sports were taking place, effectively locking everyone in. Both of these reasons led to the focus being shifted from the children enjoying and completing their sports activities onto organising parents and cares and site security.

We are very keen to invite parents and carers into school whenever we can. We will look again at the arrangements for sports mornings when we plan next year's calendar, taking your feedback from the coffee mornings into account.

National testing in Years 1, 2 and 4

All children in all schools across the country in Years 1, 2 and 4 will be completing some tests this term. These tests are set by the Department for Education and are used in all schools across the country.

Children in **Year 4** complete the **Multiplication Tables Check**. The purpose of the Multiplication Tables Check is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is important now and in later life. Click here link to the information site for parents.

Children in **Year 1** complete the **Phonics Screening Check**. The purpose of the Phonics Screening Check is to see if your child can use and apply their phonological knowledge to both real words and nonsense words.

Children in **Year 2** complete the **end of key stage 1 assessments**. They will work on tasks to assess their knowledge, skills and understanding in reading, maths and spelling, grammar and punctuation (sometimes known as SPAG).

As a school, we receive very strict guidance on how and when we can administer these tests in school. However, we try to make the experience as stress free as possible for the children. We make sure that when they complete the tests they are working with staff that they know well and we keep everything as low key as possible. When we mention tests, sitting in silence in the sports hall in individual seats does spring to mind. Please be assured that this is nothing like how we tackle the tests in our school.
