Attendance update

I am concerned to report that we are only three weeks in to the new school year and our attendance figure is already significantly below national average.

So far this term we have lost the following days-

- 18 days due to leave of absence during term time;
- 37.5 days to illness;
- 4 days due to unauthorised absence.
- We have also recorded 20 late marks.

We do understand that some children have been genuinely unwell and their parents have provided evidence to show us that this is the case. Genuine illness is unavoidable and we certainly have no desire to sour relationships with parents who are dealing with their children's ill health in line with our expectations.

However, I am meeting with the school's Education Welfare Officer on Monday and will be writing to parents of children where attendance has already fallen well below expectation.
