Well what a week!

Firstly, we would like to wish you all a happy new year and hope you had a lovely Christmas. It all seems so long ago now! We hope you were able to spend some time, either in person or virtually, with family, friends and loved ones.

Staff came in on Monday for our training day and the heating went off during the morning. Despite the very best efforts of Mr Ruler, he could not get the heating to come back on. Following an engineer visit, a new part was ordered and fitted on Tuesday. However, we still had no heating. A leak in the pipes under the floor is thought to be the problem.

An application has been made for work to start immediately, as asbestos will need to be removed as part of the process. It is expected that the corridor will be dug up and the asbestos removed on Saturday in line with HSE regulations then the pipework replaced or fixed on Sunday. It may be the case that the heating will be back in full working order on Monday, but if there are any issues over the weekend with the work, this will not be the case. We are therefore saying that school will remain closed on Monday 11 January and we will aim to reopen to the children of critical workers on Tuesday 12 January as long as all work is completed successfully and the heating is working properly.

Again, we realise that this is disappointing news but this situation is beyond our control. We would rather reassess the situation on Monday and open on Tuesday than say we are open on Monday and have to contact parents to change plans on Sunday if there are any issues over the weekend.

Children of critical workers

Parents and carers who are critical workers and who have applied for a place in school for their child will be contacted separately with details of the arrangements for return to school.

Places have been allocated in response to requests and the deadline we put in place. Please note that we have no places available in the groups that we have set up.

The longevity of our offer in school is highly dependent on staff well-being and safety – we simply can't run the school without staff staying fit and well. We are therefore prioritising staff safety and strictly limiting class numbers.

If you are a critical worker and require provision please contact us and your name will be added to a waiting list. We will review available provision each Friday and prioritise places to those we consider most in need. We will always consider the nature of the role and whether there is anyone at home, where only one parent is a critical worker. No decision like this is ever going to be easy; your patience and understanding would be much appreciated.

Devices from the DfE

You may have read in the media that the DfE is providing **laptops and tablets** to schools to help children and families in need to access remote education during coronavirus (COVID-19). Devices have been made available for disadvantaged children in certain year groups who:

- are affected by disruption to face-to-face education at their school
- have been advised to shield because they are clinically extremely vulnerable.

We have been informed that our school is eligible for **10 devices**. Each school's allocation is based on the number of children in the school, free school meals data and an estimate of the number of devices a school already has.

We have already received requests from parents for a laptop for their child. We have kept a note of these requests. However, you can appreciate that allocating 10 laptops when we have 43 children eligible for free school meals is going to be challenging to say the least. We will be in touch when the laptops have arrived in school and when we have decided who to allocate each device to.
