Arrangements for September

Unless there is a local or national lockdown, we are planning to re-open to all pupils on **Wednesday 02 September**, following a staff training day on Tuesday 01 September as planned.

Now that new guidance has been published we are working through the process of **revising risk assessments** and consulting with governors, staff and unions ahead of a full re-opening.

As guidance can change, sometimes very quickly, we will **confirm final operational arrangements** for each year group in advance of the new school year beginning. This will be information such as start / finish times, lunch time arrangements, where to enter / exit the school site, where your child will enter / leave the school building etc. We will be releasing information soon about the one way system that will be in place for September which is part of our risk assessment. In summary, unless there is another lockdown, you can assume your child will be returning to school from Wednesday 02 September.

Thank you to those parents who took the time to complete and submit the survey we sent out. We received 68 responses, which is less than two thirds of our children. I can confirm that we will be closing at 1:15pm on Fridays during the autumn term.

Reminder about important changes to our service

From September, we will be using School Gateway for sending texts and emails, all payments (dinner money, clubs, trips and events) and for managing attendance. We will no longer be using **Parentmail**.

Reminder- Please note that from 01 September, we will no longer be accepting cash or cheque payments at the school office for school meals, clubs, trips or events. You will need to pay for these using the app or online via School Gateway. We will send out more details during the first week back in September when installation of the new system has been completed.

Please do not delete the Parentmail app or your account until we ask you to. We will be using Parentmail throughout the summer holidays to communicate with you so it is really important that you are still able to access texts and emails via this provider.
