Children should wear a plain white t-shirt, plain black or navy shorts or joggers, trainers and their school sweatshirt or cardigan to school on their PE days. Spring term meetings with class teachers

Meetings have been arranged with class teachers for **Monday 27 or Wednesday 29 March.** Meetings are for class teachers to talk to parents and carers, with their child, to discuss how they have progressed against the targets they were set in the autumn term and to look at their targets for the rest of this year. Class teachers will also be talking to you about your child's effort and attitude, their behaviour, self-organisation and attendance.

Meetings are scheduled for **10 minutes**. If you need to speak to the teacher about a more complex issue that will take longer, please arrange an alternative time to meet. **Appointment sheets** will be placed outside the classroom **from Monday 06 March**. Please sign up for an appointment on either the Monday or Wednesday. Please note that meetings for children in **Red class** will only take place on **Wednesday 29 March**.

You will receive a copy of their **spring term review sheet** before you meet with your child's class teacher. Please make sure that you have read this before meeting the class teacher.

Topic homework reminder

February half term topic homework is due to be handed in no later than **Wednesday 8th March**. Topic Homework is given instead of three weeks' worth of maths and English homework. With this in mind, we expect to see a **minimum of three tasks** that are **completed to a high standard**, and reflect the **equivalent of three weeks' worth of homework**.
