# Use of fundraising money

I am delighted to announce that we have bought some more new sets of story books using money from fundraising.

The **story books** will be used in daily phonics lessons in school as a basis for teaching reading across school. The storybooks provide **structured practice for children learning to read**. Each set of books is carefully levelled to match children's growing phonic knowledge so children can read them with accuracy, fluency and comprehension.

The books cost just over £2500. These books are in addition to the £3000 worth of reading books that we bought at the end of last year.
