<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• tell an adult if we see anything we are uncomfortable with.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• arrange to meet anyone we don't know.</li></ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• e-mail people an adult has approved.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• use internet chat rooms without adult supervision.</li></ul>
