School Christmas Card Project

Today we are sending home the artwork template from the **School Christmas Card Project**. This is a company that we work with every year. The company takes a design that your child makes on the template provided, and turns it in to personalised **Christmas cards** and a range of Christmas goodies, including **thank you cards**, **gift tags** and even **place mats**.

A proof of the Christmas card will be sent back to you to check. You will then be asked to complete an order form for any items that you want to buy.

Every year we have been delighted with the personalised Christmas items that we have received from the company. As well as being a brilliant Christmas idea, we also receive a donation from the company for school funds. The more orders we place, the more money we receive.

All of the instructions are on the back of the template. Please follow them carefully and add your child's details on to the label provided. **Completed templates must be returned to school by Friday 26 October**, as this is when they are being picked up by the company. If you miss this deadline your child's design will not be made in to a Christmas card or any of the other goodies.

Keeping children safe

I have received a number of reports of parents using their mobile phones while driving children to and from school and also children running, scootering and cycling around unsupervised at drop off and collection times. **Using a mobile phone while driving is illegal.** If you spot someone doing this, I would advise that you call the police.

Children must be supervised by their parents before and after school ends. We are next to a very busy road and bordered by two smaller but busy roads. The consequences of children running on to any of these roads would be unthinkable. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure their children are safe by supervising them closely.

Last reminder about admissions to Year 5 in September 2019

At the end of this school year, Year 4 children will move to Year 5. As we are part of a three tier partnership of schools, this means that they will move to a middle school. Children in our school usually transfer to Seaton Sluice Middle School, as we are one of their feeder first schools. Parents have the right to apply for a place for their child at Seaton Sluice Middle School or any other school of their choice. Year 5 may seem a long way off, but the deadline for applications for Year 5 places closes on Wednesday 31 October 2018.

In recent years a number of our Year 4 parents have not completed the application process for a Year 5 place for the following September by the deadline. This has resulted in very difficult situations as both Seaton Sluice Middle School and Whytrig Middle School are regularly oversubscribed. It is absolutely vital that you apply for a Year 5 place in middle school by Wednesday 31 October 2018. Please visit the admissions pages on the County Council's website and read the Middle, High and Secondary School Admissions Handbook 2018 – 2019. This explains how to register online.
