Scarlet fever update

In recent days, we have seen increased media coverage and raised public anxiety regarding scarlet fever and Group A Streptococcal infections, especially in children, following a small number of tragic deaths.

Scarlet fever is a common childhood infection caused by Streptococcus pyogenes (also known as group A Streptococcus [GAS]). These bacteria may be found on the skin, throat and other sites where they can live without causing problems.

GAS can cause infections including sore throat, impetigo and scarlet fever which although unpleasant, are generally minor illnesses. On rare occasions GAS can cause severe or invasive disease, including pneumonia and septicaemia.

It is important to remember that the overall risk to the population remains very low. However, as a precautionary measure, extra vigilance is paramount.

What to look out for

- Common symptoms of scarlet fever include a sore throat, often with a red, swollen tongue, headache, fever and pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel.
- On darker skin, the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel.

Scarlet fever is typically treated with a course of **antibiotics**. If a pupil has scarlet fever, parents/carers should keep them at home until at least 24 hours after the start of antibiotic treatment to avoid spreading the infection to others.

I completely understand that many of you are worried about your child contracting scarlet fever, and God forbid, Strep A. To clarify, we have been informed that one child in Reception was confirmed at the weekend as having scarlet fever. The child was treated with antibiotics and was kept off school in line with NHS and school guidance. The child returned to school in line with NHS and school guidance.

A number of issues have arisen from information being shared on various parents' chat groups regarding scarlet fever. This is increasing anxiety for everyone. **Speculation about possible scarlet fever cases and opinions on what action the school should take is really not helpful.**

If you take your child to the doctors or hospital and a case of scarlet fever is confirmed, please inform us at school. All schools are required to inform the local authority and the UKHSA Health Protection Team if they have a positive case. This gives the UKHSA an accurate picture about the number and location of scarlet fever cases so they can advise schools accordingly. If we do not have the correct information from parents we cannot pass it to the UKHSA and seek their advice.

If a deep clean or closure of any class or classes in our school was required, we would have been informed of this by both the UKHSA and the local authority health and safety team.

We are aware that some children are experiencing some or all of the common symptoms of scarlet fever and they are absent from school. We know this is a very worrying time for everyone. Please keep us up to date with any confirmed cases so we can take appropriate action at school as directed by the UKHSA. If you are worried about your child, please speak to us directly.

All staff must attend **Child Protection training** on **Tuesday 13 December** with our governors straight after school. There will be no after school club and no singing club on Tuesday 13 December. An extra session of singing has been booked for Tuesday 20 December. We have written to all families who attend singing club and who are regular users of the after school club to let them know.
