Creative day for Chinese New Year on Monday 30 January

We have organised a whole school creative day to celebrate Chinese New Year on Monday 30 January. Children in all year groups will be learning about traditions and customs relating to the Chinese New Year celebrations. We will also be serving a Chinese themed meal for lunch for children in Early Years class 2 and Years 1 to 4. The menu for the meal and an order form is attached. Building work

- Preparation for improvements to the building have already started. A hording has been
 put up in the corridor outside Year 1 to ensure the work being done on the corridor
 windows is kept completely separate from the children and to allow the corridor to
 remain in use.
- Work to remove and replace the existing windows is due to start on Monday 09 January.
- The first phase of work will be the removal and replacement of the existing windows in the Year 1 classroom and the corridor outside Year 1. A new classroom door will also be built in to the Cheviot View side of the classroom.
- The same work will be completed in the Year 2, 3 and 4 classrooms.
- While this work is taking place the Year 1 class will be based in the ICT Suite and the Club Room. Please drop off all Year 1 children at the Club Room every morning and collect them from the bottom yard at 3:15pm for the duration of the building work.
- We have a plan for where each class will be located while the work is being done in their classroom. The plan is based on the children having the least amount of upheaval while the work is being done. We will let parents of children in each class know when their classroom is being renovated, where their children will be located and the arrangements for dropping off and collection.
- Work in the Early Years unit and the hall will be completed in February half term holidays.

Many of you have commented on how different the middle garden looks without the trees. These were removed during the Christmas holidays. The work to remove and replace the existing corridor roof would not have been possible due to the overhanging branches. The option to remove these branches and keep the tress was not possible as removal of major branches would have made the remaining limbs unstable and potentially dangerous. The trees were all around 80 years old and without the protection they had from being in the enclosed middle garden, they would have been unlikely to have survived this long.

After school football club

After school football club will start on **Tuesday 10 January** for boys and girls in Years 2 and 3. The club will be run by Mr Dowson, who will also be teaching football to Years 2 and 3 in their PE lessons on Tuesday afternoons. Mr Dowson has worked with us already on a number of occasions. A separate letter has been sent out to Years 2 and 3.

After school homework club

After school homework club will start on **Monday 09 January** for some boys and girls in Years 1 to 4. The club will be run by a teacher each week. A separate letter has been sent out to parents of children who have been invited to attend. At this time, homework club is only for those children who have received an invitation to attend.
